

Presidential election not to dampen India-US ties

‘Common enemy’ China to drive momentum

Washington, Nov. 3: Irrespective of the outcome of the November 3 presidential elections, relationship between India and the US is expected to continue at the same pace as it has in the last two decades and strengthen further, policy documents and remarks from the two campaigns indicate.

President Donald Trump, in the first term of his presidency, has emerged as the best friend of India at the White House taking the relationship to a new level and his friendship with Prime Minister Narendra Modi is well known, which was reflected in the two addressing massive two joint rallies in the US and India in less than a year.

Former vice president Joe Biden, the Democratic presidential candidate, has a strong track record of being an ardent advocate of a strong India-US relationship both as a

Senator from Delaware for over three decades and then as deputy of President Barack Obama for eight years.

From playing a key role in the passage of India-US civil nuclear deal during a Republican administration to setting up the goal of a \$ 500 billion in bilateral trade, Biden has strong ties with Indian leadership across the aisle and has a large number of Indian Americans within his close circuit.

The ground for India-US relationship post November 3 was laid down during the recently concluded 2+2 ministerial held in New Delhi. Officials from the two countries, both during and after the ministerial, underscored that the ties have bipartisan support and it is not based on which party occupies the White House or have a majority in the House of

Representatives and the Senate.

It is very well expected that there could be a change in nuances or emphasis on certain elements of relationship, on who occupies the White House or have majority in the Congress, the common national interest of the two countries in terms of democracy and threat being posed by China, would drive the momentum between India and the US.

Under the Trump administration, defence and energy are being identified as two key pillars of the relationship, along with the cooperation and collaboration in the health sector in the wake of the coronavirus pandemic. However, differences on issues related to bilateral trade, foreign workers visas would continue to remain.

Notably, India is the only major country

with which the Trump administration failed to arrive at a trade deal, even a mini-trade deal, despite the fact the top leadership of both India and the US expressed their desire to do so. Given the track record of differences between the two countries for the last three decades, the sharp differences are likely to remain the same even during a Biden administration.

However, the bilateral trade is likely to grow at a fast pace between India and the US irrespective of who comes to power. Officials from the two countries are likely to pick up the thread from the trade negotiations that they have almost concluded this year. India will continue to place massive orders towards purchase of defence equipment and take the bilateral energy trade to a new level.

Trump, Biden in last mile stretch

Washington, Nov. 3: President Donald Trump and his Democratic challenger Joe Biden were making a last ditch efforts on Monday to convince undecided voters of their plans and policies on the final day of the campaign in critical battleground states, with polls indicating that the race for the White House could be headed for a photo-finish.

The two candidates spent Sunday making their final pitches to

voters ahead of Tuesday’s election. Trump, 74, toured five battleground states of Michigan, Iowa, North Carolina, Georgia and Florida while his 77-year-old rival spoke at a campaign event in Pennsylvania, where the race also looks tight.

Trump, a Republican, plans a hectic campaign trip through Wisconsin and Pennsylvania on Monday, aimed at saving the key states he won four years ago.

Both Biden and Trump

are also trying to woo Indian-American voters, one of the critical voting blocs in this year’s election.

There is an estimated four million Indian-American population of which about 2.5 million are potential voters in the November 2020 presidential elections. Over 1.3 million Indian-Americans are voters in key battleground states, including Texas, Michigan, Florida and Pennsylvania.

Amidst the raging COVID-19 pandemic, Americans have voted in large numbers, already casting a record 93 million ballots, about two-thirds of the overall 2016 vote count of 138.8 million. Some 239 million people are eligible to vote this year. The mail-in ballots could take days or weeks to be counted in some states - meaning a winner might not be declared in the hours after polls close on Tuesday. The figure of 93 million includes 33 million in-person votes and 58 million mail-in ballots. National polls continue to show Biden leading Trump, by about 8 percentage points.

US elections, however, are not determined by the national popular vote, but rather in the 538-member Electoral College, with each candidate needing a majority of 270 to win the presidency.

In all but two of the country’s 50 states, either Trump or Biden will win all the electors from each state by winning the popular vote there, with the most populous states holding the most electors.

Trump gets veterans to monitor voting frauds

Washington, Nov 3: A veteran Republican operative who got his start in politics by helping to persuade a judge to throw out hundreds of mail-in ballots is organising an “army” of volunteers for US President Donald Trump’s campaign to monitor voting in Democratic-leaning areas on Tuesday.

Mike Roman, Trump’s director of Election Day Operations, is a former White House aide from Pennsylvania who gathered claims in 1993 of voter fraud, resulting in a court ruling overturning election results and getting his candidate seated in the Pennsylvania State Senate.

It is a strategy that Trump has been

advocating on Twitter and on the stump.

For months, the president has been trying to undercut the validity of mail-in ballots, a long-used method of voting that was up this year because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Over the last week, Trump has also suggested that any votes tabulated after Election Day are suspect, even as his campaign has opposed plans by election officials to start counting mail-in ballots early. Roman, who previously ran the secretive in-house intelligence unit for the political network led by GOP mega-donors Charles and David Koch, has organised a purported 50,000 poll watchers, many of them through an “Army For Trump” website that asks his supporters to “enlist” in his reelection fight. The campaign also has hired full-time staff in at least 11 battleground states to organise the effort, several of them young lawyers.

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Delhi Capitals finish second; RCB also qualify

Abu Dhabi, Nov. 3: Delhi Capitals qualified for the Indian Premier League play-offs at number two position with a six-wicket win over Royal Challengers Bangalore here on Monday.

RCB also entered the playoffs after DC took more than 17.3 overs to complete their chase.

It’s down to KKR or SRH as to who will finish in the top four

and meet RCB in the eliminator. If SRH beat MI, they’ll finish third; if MI continue their fine form, KKR will finish fourth and play RCB.

Invited to bat, Royal Challengers Bangalore scored 152 for seven in the stipulated 20 overs. Young Devdutt Padikkal top-scored with a 41-ball 50. In reply, DC chased down the target with six balls to spare.

“It’s a mixed bag.

You come to games to try and get a result your way. Through probably the 11th over, the 17.3 mark was informed by the management. Even if the game was drifting away, we controlled the middle overs well enough,” RCB skipper Virat Kohli said.

“I think we’ve played good enough cricket in this tournament to qualify. We have two games to the final

now. We can be more brave in the back end, probably be better in the powerplay with the ball which has been our strength. You take what you can with these games,” he added.

“Chuffed with the performance. We knew it was a do or die and we just focused on the win, not NRR. The teams who won in the latter half completely changed the scenario. It’s a really competitive tournament for sure. I feel that the bowlers were really up with their plans and knew what they had to execute,” Delhi Capitals captain Shreyas Iyer stated.

“We had a few sessions back in the hotel on the strengths and weaknesses of the opposition and it worked out today. Mumbai are one of the best teams in the tournament. We need to keep things simple, that’s what we discussed in the meetings. Stick to the basics. The more you keep things simple, the easier it gets,” he explained.

Johnson justifies 2nd lockdown as virus cases surge

London, Nov. 3: British Prime Minister Boris Johnson said on Monday that there is “no alternative” but to impose a second England-wide lockdown as he tabled his proposals to curb the surge in coronavirus cases before members of Parliament.

He rejected Opposition allegations that the government has been “slow” to act and said “no one wants to impose measures unless absolutely essential”.

“When the data changes course, we must change course too,” he told MPs in the House of Commons, who must vote on the plans for them to take effect from Thursday.

“There is no

alternative but to take action at a national level I am truly sorry for the anguish these rules will cause businesses,” Johnson said, as he thanked his senior Cabinet minister and Downing Street neighbour, Chancellor Rishi Sunak, for his “creativity” in coming up with support packages to help businesses through the crisis.

Johnson had announced the second England-wide stay-at-home lockdown on Saturday after details of a high-level Cabinet meeting were leaked ahead of schedule.

He told the Commons on Monday that failing to act would risk the state-funded National Health Service (NHS)

being overwhelmed and doctors having to choose which patients to treat and having a knock-on effect for other kinds of care.

He warned that COVID-19 is “doubling faster than we could conceivably add capacity” to the health service.

According to the details laid out before Parliament, the measures will “expire” on December 2 and after that the plan is for England to revert to the current tiered system of localised restrictions, with MPs given a say on the way forward at that stage. The PM also pledged a “steady but massive” expansion of rapid testing for COVID-19.

Exercise Malabar first phase off Visakhapatnam coast

New Delhi, Nov. 3: The first phase of the Exercise Malabar among the navies of India, the US, Japan and Australia will kick start off Visakhapatnam in the Bay of Bengal on Tuesday, in a reflection of growing congruence in strategic interests of the four nations.

The exercise is taking place at a time India and China are locked in a nearly six-month-long bitter border standoff in eastern Ladakh that has significantly strained their ties. Japan, Australia and the US are also having friction with China in the last few months over a variety of issues.

Last month, India announced that Australia will be part of the exercise which effectively

made it a drill by all four member nations of the Quad or Quadrilateral coalition, which is primarily focusing on containing China’s military expansionism in the Indo-Pacific region.

The first segment of the exercise will be from November 3 to 6 while the second phase of the drill is scheduled to be held from November 17 to 20 in the Arabian sea.

“The exercise, being conducted as a ‘non-contact, at sea only’ exercise in view of COVID-19 pandemic, will showcase the high-levels of synergy and coordination between the friendly navies, which is based on their shared values and commitment to an open, inclusive Indo-Pacific and a rules-

based international order,” the Indian Navy said in a statement on Monday. The Indian Navy will deploy a number of key platforms in the exercise which will include destroyer Ranvijay, frigate Shivalik, off-shore patrol vessel Sukanya, fleet support ship Shakti and submarine Sindhuraj. Also, advanced jet trainer Hawk, long-range maritime patrol aircraft P-8I, Dornier maritime patrol aircraft, and

several helicopters will be participating in the exercise, officials said.

US Navy ship USS John S McCain, a guided-missile destroyer, Australian Navy’s long-range frigate HMAS Ballarat with integral MH-60 helicopter and Japan Maritime Self Defence Force’s JS Onami, a destroyer, will be among key platforms to be part of the first phase of the Malabar exercise, they said.
